STATE OF GEORGIA STATE ENTITY STANDARD CONTRACT Attachment 1

Contract Terms and Conditions for Goods and Ancillary Services - OPEN

A. DEFINITIONS AND GENERAL INFORMATION

- 1. **Definitions.** The following words shall be defined as set forth below:
 - (i) "Contractor" means the provider of the goods and services under the Contract.
 - (ii) "Purchase Instrument" means the documentation issued by the State Entity to the Contractor for a purchase of goods and services in accordance with the terms and conditions of the Contract. It may include an identification of the items to be purchased, the delivery date and location, the address where the Contractor should submit the invoices, and any other requirements deemed necessary by the State Entity.
 - (iii) "Response", "Contractor's Response" or "Final Response" means the Contractor's submitted response to the RFP, including any modifications or clarifications accepted by the State Entity.
 - (iv) "RFP" means the Request for Proposal, Request for Bid, or other solicitation document (and any amendments or addenda thereto) specifically identified in the State Entity Standard Contract Form that was issued to solicit the goods and services that are subject to the Contract.
 - (v) "State" means the State of Georgia, the State Entity, and any other authorized state entities issuing Purchase Instruments against the Contract.
 - (vi) "State Entity" means the State of Georgia governmental entity identified in the State Entity Standard Contract Form to contract with the Contractor for the goods and services identified in the Contract.
 - (vii) "State Entity Standard Contract" or "Contract" means the agreement between the State Entity and the Contractor as defined by the State Entity Standard Contract Form and its incorporated documents.
 - (viii) "State Entity Standard Contract Form" means the document that contains basic information about the Contract and incorporates by reference the applicable Contract Terms and Conditions, the RFP, Contractor's Response to the RFP, the final pricing documentation for goods and services and any mutually agreed clarifications, modifications, additions and deletions resulting from final contract negotiations. No objection or amendment by a Contractor to the RFP requirements or the Contract shall be incorporated by reference into this Contract unless the State Entity has accepted the Contractor's objection or amendment in writing. The State Entity Standard Contract Form is defined separately and referred to separately throughout the State Entity Standard Contract as a means of identifying the location of certain information. For example, the initial term of the Contract is defined by the dates in the State Entity Standard Contract Form.
 - (ix) Alternative Brands: Determined at Georgia Department of Corrections' (GDC) sole discretion to be an acceptable generic option to premium brands.

- (x) Brand Name or Equal: Nationally available resale items procured by brand name for which contractor may offer alternative brands. These items are regularly sold outside commissary stores, such as commercial grocery stores and other retail operations, under the same brand name.
- (xi) CACTAS: Cashless Systems Commissary and Trust Fund Accounting Software-financial accounting and inventory tracking system; used for the purpose of ordering products, accounting for inventory, and conducting inventory management activities.
- (xii) Sales Exceptions: Items, sold within a store site, that do not match the list maintained in the inventory management system for that location. Items may require manual additions to be managed by the vendor within a 24 hour period.
- (xiii) GDC: Georgia Department of Corrections.
- (xiv) Generic Products: Products with no associated brand name.
- (xv) Master Product List (MPL): Contains a listing of all products that have been evaluated and determined to meet the performance requirements for GDC. Inclusion of a product in the MPL is not an endorsement by GDC.
- (xvi) Must Have Products: Nationally available resale items procured by brand name which contractor must offer to be considered for award. No alternative brands will be considered for these products. These items are regularly sold outside commissary stores, such as commercial grocery stores and other retail operations, under the same brand name. (examples include Coca Cola, Nestle, Kellogg's and Lay's)
- 2. Priority of Contract Provisions. Any pre-printed contract terms and conditions included on Contractor's forms or invoices shall be null and void.
- 3. Reporting Requirements. Contractor shall provide all reports required by the RFP. In addition, unless otherwise provided in the RFP, Contractor shall keep a record of the purchases made pursuant to the Contract and shall submit a quarterly written report to the State Entity.

B. DURATION OF CONTRACT

1. Contract Term. The initial term of the contract shall be for one (1) calendar year from the effective date of the contract. The Georgia Department of Corrections shall possess four (4), one (1) year option(s) to renew; options shall be exercisable at the sole discretion of the State Entity. Renewal will be accomplished through the issuance of Notice of Award Amendment. All prices will be fixed for the base year, price increases will be determined annually at the time option periods are exercised based on the methodology further described in this RFP.

The Contract between the State Entity and the Contractor shall begin and end on the dates specified in the State Entity Standard Contract Form, unless terminated earlier in accordance with the applicable terms and conditions. Pursuant to O.C.G.A. Section 50-5-64, this Contract shall not be deemed to create a debt of the State for the payment of any sum beyond the fiscal year of execution or, in the event of a renewal, beyond the fiscal year of such renewal.

- 2. Contract Renewal. The State Entity shall have the option, in its sole discretion, to renew the Contract for additional renewals as defined in the State Entity Standard Contract Form on a year-to-year basis by giving the Contractor written notice of the renewal decision at least sixty (60) days prior to the expiration of the initial term or renewal term. Renewal will depend upon the best interests of the State, funding, and Contractor's performance. Renewal will be accomplished through the issuance of a Notice of Award Amendment. Upon the State Entity's election, in its sole discretion, to renew any part of this Contract, Contractor shall remain obligated to perform in strict accordance with this Contract unless otherwise agreed by the State Entity and the Contractor.
- 3. Contract Extension. In the event that this State Entity Standard Contract shall terminate or be likely to terminate prior to the making of an award for a new contract for the identified goods and services, the State Entity may, with the written consent of Contractor, extend this Contract for such period as may be necessary to afford the State a continuous supply of the identified goods and services.

C. DESCRIPTION OF GOODS AND SERVICES

1. Specifications in Bidding Documents. GCS shall provide all goods and services required in the RFP that comply with the specifications contained in the RFP and the terms of the Contract, plus those goods, services and deliverables as may additionally be described in the Response. GCS shall provide: delivery of all commissary products on the approved MPL; CACTAS, a web-based financial accounting and inventory tracking system; and any related equipment, such as shelving, required by GDC commissaries.

Each facility shall receive weekly delivery of all ordered commissary items at a specified time and noted in attachment A: GDC Commissary Delivery Schedule and Specifications. GCS shall provide an invoice with each delivery. Invoices are processed weekly. Store purchases made by offenders will be processed and paid through an internal GDC inmate account system known as Scribe in conjunction with a financial accounting and inventory tracking system.

2. Product Shipment and Delivery. All products shall be shipped F.O.B. destination. Destination shall be the location(s) specified in the RFP or any provided Purchase Instrument. All items shall be at the Contractor's risk until they have been delivered and accepted by the receiving entity. All items shall be subject to inspection on delivery. Hidden damage will remain the responsibility of the Contractor to remedy without cost to the State Entity, regardless of when the hidden damage is discovered.

- 3. Non-Exclusive Rights. The Contract is not exclusive. The State Entity reserves the right to select other contractors to provide goods and services similar to goods and services described in the Contract during the term of the Contract.
- **4. No Minimums Guaranteed.** The Contract does not guarantee any minimum level of purchases.

D. COMPENSATION

- 1. Pricing. The Contractor will be paid for the goods and services sold pursuant to the Contract in accordance with the RFP and final pricing documents as incorporated into the State Entity Standard Contract Form and the terms of the Contract. Unless clearly stated otherwise in the State Entity Standard Contract, all prices are firm and fixed and are not subject to variation. Prices include, but are not limited to freight, insurance, fuel surcharges and customs duties.
- 2. Billings. If applicable, and unless the RFP provides otherwise, the Contractor shall invoice each facility's order at the time of delivery. Payment will be made by each facility individually. If multiple orders are made during a week, Contractor shall issue an invoice for each order separately, to the billing address specified in the Purchase Instrument or Contract. The invoice shall comply with all applicable rules concerning payment of such claims. The State Entity shall pay all approved invoices in arrears and in accordance with applicable provisions of state law.

Unless otherwise agreed in writing by the parties, the Contractor shall not be entitled to receive any other payment or compensation from the State Entity for any goods or services provided by or on behalf of the Contractor under the Contract. The Contractor shall be solely responsible for paying all costs, expenses and charges it incurs in connection with its performance under the Contract.

- 3. Delay of Payment Due to Contractor's Failure. If the State Entity in good faith determines that the Contractor has failed to perform or deliver any service or product as required by the Contract, the Contractor shall not be entitled to any compensation under the Contract until such service or product is performed or delivered. In this event, the State Entity may withhold that portion of the Contractor's compensation which represents payment for services or products that were not performed or delivered. To the extent that the Contractor's failure to perform or deliver in a timely manner causes the State Entity to incur costs, the State Entity may deduct the amount of such incurred costs from any amounts payable to Contractor. The State Entity's authority to deduct such incurred costs shall not in any way affect the State Entity's authority to terminate the Contract.
- 4. Set-Off Against Sums Owed by the Contractor. In the event that the Contractor owes the State Entity and/or the State any sum under the terms of the Contract, pursuant to any judgment, or pursuant to any law, the State Entity and/or the State may set off the sum owed to the State Entity and/or the State against any sum owed by the State Entity and/or the State to the Contractor in the State Entity's sole discretion.

E. TERMINATION

1. Immediate Termination. Pursuant to O.C.G.A. Section 50-5-64, this Contract will terminate immediately and absolutely if the State Entity determines that adequate funds are not appropriated or granted or funds are de-appropriated such that the State Entity cannot fulfill its obligations under the Contract, which determination is at the State Entity's sole discretion and shall be conclusive. Further, the State Entity may terminate the Contract for any one or more of the following reasons effective immediately without advance notice:

- (i) In the event the Contractor is required to be certified or licensed as a condition precedent to providing goods and services, the revocation or loss of such license or certification may result in immediate termination of the Contract effective as of the date on which the license or certification is no longer in effect;
- (ii) The State Entity determines that the actions, or failure to act, of the Contractor, its agents, employees or subcontractors have caused, or reasonably could cause, life, health or safety to be jeopardized;
- (iii) The Contractor fails to comply with confidentiality laws or provisions; and/or
- (iv) The Contractor furnished any statement, representation or certification in connection with the Contract or the bidding process which is materially false, deceptive, incorrect or incomplete.
- 2. Termination for Cause. The occurrence of any one or more of the following events shall constitute cause for the State Entity to declare the Contractor in default of its obligations under the Contract:
 - (i) The Contractor fails to deliver or has delivered nonconforming goods or services or fails to perform, to the State Entity's satisfaction, any material requirement of the Contract or is in violation of a material provision of the Contract, including, but without limitation, the express warranties made by the Contractor;
 - (ii) The State Entity determines that satisfactory performance of the Contract is substantially endangered or that a default is likely to occur;
 - (iii) The Contractor fails to make substantial and timely progress toward performance of the Contract:
 - (iv) The Contractor becomes subject to any bankruptcy or insolvency proceeding under federal or state law to the extent allowed by applicable federal or state law including bankruptcy laws; the Contractor terminates or suspends its business; or the State Entity reasonably believes that the Contractor has become insolvent or unable to pay its obligations as they accrue consistent with applicable federal or state law;
 - (v) The Contractor has failed to comply with applicable federal, state and local laws, rules, ordinances, regulations and orders when performing within the scope of the Contract;
 - (vi) The Contractor has engaged in conduct that has or may expose the State Entity or the State to liability, as determined in the State Entity's sole discretion; or
 - (vii) The Contractor has infringed any patent, trademark, copyright, trade dress or any other intellectual property rights of the State Entity, the State, or a third party.
- 3. Notice of Default. If there is a default event caused by the Contractor, the State Entity shall provide written notice to the Contractor requesting that the breach or noncompliance be remedied within the period of time specified in the State Entity's written notice to the Contractor. If the breach or noncompliance is not remedied within the period of time specified in the written notice, the State Entity may:
 - (i) Immediately terminate the Contract without additional written notice; and/or

- (ii) Procure substitute goods or services from another source and charge the difference between the Contract and the substitute contract to the defaulting Contractor; and/or,
- (iii) Enforce the terms and conditions of the Contract and seek any legal or equitable remedies.
- **1. Termination Upon Notice.** Following thirty (30) days' written notice, the State Entity may terminate the Contract in whole or in part without the payment of any penalty or incurring any further obligation to the Contractor. Following termination upon notice, the Contractor shall be entitled to compensation, upon submission of invoices and proper proof of claim, for goods and services provided under the Contract to the State Entity up to and including the date of termination.
- **5. Termination Due to Change in Law.** The State Entity shall have the right to terminate this Contract without penalty by giving thirty (30) days' written notice to the Contractor as a result of any of the following:
 - (i) The State Entity's authorization to operate is withdrawn or there is a material alteration in the programs administered by the State Entity; and/or
 - (ii) The State Entity's duties are substantially modified.
- 6. Payment Limitation in Event of Termination. In the event of termination of the Contract for any reason by the State Entity, the State Entity shall pay only those amounts, if any, due and owing to the Contractor for goods and services actually rendered up to and including the date of termination of the Contract and for which the State Entity is obligated to pay pursuant to the Contract or Purchase Instrument. Payment will be made only upon submission of invoices and proper proof of the Contractor's claim. This provision in no way limits the remedies available to the State Entity under the Contract in the event of termination. The State Entity shall not be liable for any costs incurred by the Contractor in its performance of the Contract, including, but not limited to, startup costs, overhead or other costs associated with the performance of the Contract.
- **7. The Contractor's Termination Duties.** Upon receipt of notice of termination or upon request of the State Entity, the Contractor shall:
 - (i) Cease work under the Contract and take all necessary or appropriate steps to limit disbursements and minimize costs, and furnish a report within thirty (30) days of the date of notice of termination, describing the status of all work under the Contract, including, without limitation, results accomplished, conclusions resulting therefrom, and any other matters the State Entity may require;
 - (ii) Immediately cease using and return to the State Entity, any personal property or materials, whether tangible or intangible, provided by the State Entity to the Contractor;
 - (iii) Comply with the State Entity's instructions for the timely transfer of any active files and work product produced by the Contractor under the Contract;
 - (iv) Cooperate in good faith with the State Entity, its employees, agents and contractors during the transition period between the notification of termination and the substitution of any replacement contractor; and
 - (v) Immediately return to the State Entity any payments made by the State Entity for goods and services that were not delivered or rendered by the Contractor.

F. CONFIDENTIAL INFORMATION

- 1. Access to Confidential Data. The Contractor's employees, agents and subcontractors may have access to confidential data maintained by the State to the extent necessary to carry out the Contractor's responsibilities under the Contract. The Contractor shall presume that all information received pursuant to the Contract is confidential unless otherwise designated by the State. If it is reasonably likely the Contractor will have access to the State's confidential information, then:
 - (i) The Contractor shall provide to the State a written description of the Contractor's policies and procedures to safeguard confidential information;
 - (ii) Policies of confidentiality shall address, as appropriate, information conveyed in verbal, written, and electronic formats;
 - (iii) The Contractor must designate one individual who shall remain the responsible authority in charge of all data collected, used, or disseminated by the Contractor in connection with the performance of the Contract; and
 - (iv) The Contractor shall provide adequate supervision and training to its agents, employees and subcontractors to ensure compliance with the terms of the Contract.

The private or confidential data shall remain the property of the State at all times. Some services performed for the State Entity may require the Contractor to sign a nondisclosure agreement. Contractor understands and agrees that refusal or failure to sign such a nondisclosure agreement, if required, may result in termination of the Contract.

- 2. No Dissemination of Confidential Data. No confidential data collected, maintained, or used in the course of performance of the Contract shall be disseminated except as authorized by law and with the written consent of the State, either during the period of the Contract or thereafter. Any data supplied to or created by the Contractor shall be considered the property of the State. The Contractor must return any and all data collected, maintained, created or used in the course of the performance of the Contract, in whatever form it is maintained, promptly at the request of the State.
- **3. Subpoena.** In the event that a subpoena or other legal process is served upon the Contractor for records containing confidential information, the Contractor shall promptly notify the State and cooperate with the State in any lawful effort to protect the confidential information.
- **4. Reporting of Unauthorized Disclosure.** The Contractor shall immediately report to the State any unauthorized disclosure of confidential information.
- **5. Survives Termination.** The Contractor's confidentiality obligation under the Contract shall survive termination of the Contract.

G. INDEMNIFICATION

1. Contractor's Indemnification Obligation. The Contractor agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the State and State officers, employees, agents, and volunteers (collectively, "Indemnified Parties") from any and all costs, expenses, losses, claims, damages, liabilities, settlements and judgments, including reasonable value of the time spent by the Attorney General's Office, related to or arising from:

- (i) Any breach of the Contract;
- (ii) Any negligent, intentional or wrongful act or omission of the Contractor or any employee, agent or subcontractor utilized or employed by the Contractor;
- (iii) Any failure of goods to comply with applicable specifications, warranties, and certifications under the Contract;
- (iv) The negligence or fault of the Contractor in design, testing, development, manufacture, or otherwise with respect to the goods or any parts thereof provided under the Contract:
- (v) Claims, demands, or lawsuits that, with respect to the goods or any parts thereof, allege product liability, strict product liability, or any variation thereof;
- (vi) The Contractor's performance or attempted performance of the Contract, including any employee, agent or subcontractor utilized or employed by the Contractor;
- (vii) Any failure by the Contractor to comply with the "Compliance with the Law" provision of the Contract;
- (viii) Any failure by the Contractor to make all reports, payments and withholdings required by federal and state law with respect to social security, employee income and other taxes, fees or costs required by the Contractor to conduct business in the State of Georgia or the United States;
- (ix) Any infringement of any copyright, trademark, patent, trade dress, or other intellectual property right; or
- (x) Any failure by the Contractor to adhere to the confidentiality provisions of the Contract.
- 2. Duty to Reimburse State Tort Claims Fund. To the extent such damage or loss as covered by this indemnification is covered by the State of Georgia Tort Claims Fund ("the Fund"), the Contractor (and its insurers) agrees to reimburse the Fund. To the full extent permitted by the Constitution and the laws of the State and the terms of the Fund, the Contractor and its insurers waive any right of subrogation against the State, the Indemnified Parties, and the Fund and insurers participating thereunder, to the full extent of this indemnification.
- 3. Litigation and Settlements. The Contractor shall, at its own expense, be entitled to and shall have the duty to participate in the defense of any suit against the Indemnified Parties. No settlement or compromise of any claim, loss or damage entered into by the Indemnified Parties shall be binding upon Contractor unless approved in writing by Contractor. No settlement or compromise of any claim, loss or damage entered into by Contractor shall be binding upon the Indemnified Parties unless approved in writing by the Indemnified Parties.
- 4. Patent/Copyright Infringement Indemnification. Contractor shall, at its own expense, be entitled to and shall have the duty to participate in the defense of any suit instituted against the State and indemnify the State against any award of damages and costs made against the State by a final judgment of a court of last resort in such suit insofar as the same is based on any claim that any of the goods constitutes an infringement of any United States Letters Patent or copyright, provided the State gives the Contractor immediate notice in writing of the institution of such suit, permits Contractor to fully participate in the defense of the same, and gives Contractor all available information, assistance and authority to enable Contractor to do so. Subject to approval of the Attorney General of the State of Georgia, the State Entity shall

tender defense of any such action to Contractor upon request by Contractor. Contractor shall not be liable for any award of judgment against the State reached by compromise or settlement unless Contractor accepts the compromise or settlement. Contractor shall have the right to enter into negotiations for and the right to effect settlement or compromise of any such action, but no such settlement shall be binding upon the State unless approved by the State.

In case any of the goods is in any suit held to constitute infringement and its use is enjoined, Contractor shall, at its option and expense:

- (i) Procure for the State Entity the right to continue using the goods;
- (ii) Replace or modify the same so that it becomes non-infringing; or
- (iii) Remove the same and cancel any future charges pertaining thereto.

Contractor, however, shall have no liability to the State if any such patent, or copyright infringement or claim thereof is based upon or arises out of:

- (i) Compliance with designs, plans or specifications furnished by or on behalf of the State Entity as to the goods;
- (ii) Use of the goods in combination with apparatus or devices not supplied by Contractor;
- (iii) Use of the goods in a manner for which the same was neither designed nor contemplated; or
- (iv) The claimed infringement of any patent or copyright in which the State Entity or any affiliate or subsidiary of the State Entity has any direct interest by license or otherwise.
- **5. Survives Termination.** The indemnification obligation of the Contractor shall survive termination of the Contract.

H. INSURANCE

GCS shall procure and maintain insurance which shall protect the contractor and the State of Georgia (as an additional insured) from any claims for bodily injury, property damage, or personal injury covered by the indemnification obligations set forth in the contract attached to this solicitation throughout the duration of the contract. The contractor shall procure and maintain the insurance policies described below at the contractor's own expense and shall furnish the State Entity an insurance certificate listing the State of Georgia as certificate holder and as an additional insured. The insurance certificate must document that the Commercial General Liability insurance coverage purchased by the contractor includes contractual liability coverage applicable to the contract. In addition, the insurance certificate must provide the following information: the name and address of the insured; name, address, telephone number and signature of the authorized agent; name of the insurance company (authorized to operate in Georgia); a description of coverage in detailed standard terminology (including policy period, policy number, limits of liability, exclusions and endorsements); and an acknowledgment of notice of cancellation to the State Entity.

The contractor is required to maintain the following insurance coverage's during the term of the contract:

1. Workers Compensation Insurance (Occurrence) in the amounts of the statutory limits

established by the General Assembly of the State of Georgia (A self-insurer must submit a certificate from the Georgia Board of Workers Compensation stating that the contractor qualifies to pay its own workers compensation claims.) In addition, the contractor shall require all subcontractors occupying the premises or performing work under the contract to obtain an insurance certificate showing proof of Workers Compensation Coverage with the following minimum coverage:

Bodily injury by accident - per employee \$500,000; Bodily injury by disease - per employee \$500,000; Bodily injury by disease - policy limit \$500,000.

2. Commercial General Liability Policy with the following minimum coverage:

Each Occurrence Limit \$1,000,000
Personal & Advertising Injury Limit \$1,000,000
General Aggregate Limit \$2,000,000
Products/Completed Ops. Aggregate Limit \$2,000,000

3. Automobile Liability

Combined Single Limit

\$1,000,000

Certificates of Insurance showing such coverage to be in force shall be filed with the State Entity prior to commencement of any work under the contract. The foregoing policies shall be obtained from insurance companies licensed to do business in Georgia and shall be with companies acceptable to the State Entity, which must have a minimum A.M. Best rating of A-. All such coverage shall remain in full force and effect during the term and any renewal or extension thereof.

I. BONDS

GCS shall furnish a performance bond to the State Entity for the faithful performance on the contract in an amount equal to \$2,000,000.00. The bond shall be issued by a Corporate Surety authorized to do business with the State of Georgia. The performance bond must be submitted to the State Entity within ten (10) calendar days of the date in the Notice of Award (NOA).

J. WARRANTIES

- 1. Construction of Warranties Expressed in the Contract with Warranties Implied by Law. All warranties made by the Contractor and/or subcontractors in all provisions of the Contract and the Contractor's Response, whether or not the Contract specifically denominates the Contractor's and/or subcontractors' promise as a warranty or whether the warranty is created only by the Contractor's affirmation or promise, or is created by a description of the materials, goods and services to be provided, or by provision of samples to the State shall not be construed as limiting or negating any warranty provided by law, including without limitation, warranties which arise through course of dealing or usage of trade, the warranty of merchantability, and the warranty of fitness for a particular purpose. The warranties expressed in the Contract are intended to modify the warranties implied by law only to the extent that they expand the warranties applicable to the goods and services provided by the Contractor. The provisions of this section apply during the term of the Contract and any extensions or renewals thereof.
- 2. Warranty Nonconforming Goods. All goods delivered by Contractor to the State Entity shall be free from any defects in design, material, or workmanship. If any goods offered by the Contractor are found to be defective in material or workmanship, or do not conform to

Contractor's warranty, the State Entity shall have the option of returning, repairing, or replacing the defective goods at Contractor's expense. Payment for goods shall not constitute acceptance. Acceptance by the State Entity shall not relieve the Contractor of its warranty or any other obligation under the Contract.

- 3. Compliance with Federal Safety Acts. Contractor warrants and guarantees to the State that the goods provided under the Contract are in compliance with Sections 5 and 12 of the Federal Trade Commission Act; the Fair Packaging and Labeling Act; the Federal Food, Drug, and Cosmetic Act; the Consumer Product Safety Act; the Federal Environmental Pesticide Control Act; the Federal Hazardous Substances Act; the Fair Labor Standards Act; the Wool Products Labeling Act; the Flammable Fabrics Act; the Occupational Safety and Health Act; the Office of Management and Budget A-110 Appendix A; and the Anti-Kickback Act of 1986.
- 4. Originality and Title to Concepts, Materials, and Goods Produced. Contractor represents and warrants that all the concepts, materials, goods and services produced, or provided to the State pursuant to the terms of the Contract shall be wholly original with the Contractor or that the Contractor has secured all applicable interests, rights, licenses, permits or other intellectual property rights in such concepts, materials and works. The Contractor represents and warrants that the concepts, materials, goods and services and the State's use of same and the exercise by the State of the rights granted by the Contract shall not infringe upon any other work, other than material provided by the Contract to the Contractor to be used as a basis for such materials, or violate the rights of publicity or privacy of, or constitute a libel or slander against, any person, firm or corporation and that the concepts, materials and works will not infringe upon the copyright, trademark, trade name, trade dress patent, literary, dramatic, statutory, common law or any other rights of any person, firm or corporation or other entity. The Contractor represents and warrants that it is the owner of or otherwise has the right to use and distribute the goods and services contemplated by the Contract.
- 5. Conformity with Contractual Requirements. The Contractor represents and warrants that the goods and services provided in accordance with the Contract will appear and operate in conformance with the terms and conditions of the Contract.
- **6. Authority to Enter into Contract.** The Contractor represents and warrants that it has full authority to enter into the Contract and that it has not granted and will not grant any right or interest to any person or entity that might derogate, encumber or interfere with the rights granted to the State and the State Entity.
- 7. Obligations Owed to Third Parties. The Contractor represents and warrants that all obligations owed to third parties with respect to the activities contemplated to be undertaken by the Contractor pursuant to the Contract are or will be fully satisfied by the Contractor so that the State and the State Entity will not have any obligations with respect thereto.
- **8. Title to Property.** The Contractor represents and warrants that title to any property assigned, conveyed or licensed to the State is good and that transfer of title or license to the State is rightful and that all property shall be delivered free of any security interest or other lien or encumbrance.
- **9. Industry Standards.** The Contractor represents and expressly warrants that all aspects of the goods and services provided or used by it shall at a minimum conform to the standards in the Contractor's industry. This requirement shall be in addition to any express warranties, representations, and specifications included in the Contract, which shall take precedence.
- 10. Contractor's Personnel and Staffing. Contractor warrants that all persons assigned to perform services under this Contract are either lawful employees of Contractor or lawful

employees of a Subcontractor authorized by the State Entity as specified in the RFP. All persons assigned to perform services under this Contract shall be qualified to perform such services. Personnel assigned by Contractor shall have all professional licenses required to perform the services.

11. Use of State Vehicles. Contractor warrants that no State vehicles will be used by Contractor for the performance of services under this Contract. Contractor shall be responsible for providing transportation necessary to perform all services.

K. PRODUCT RECALL

In the event that any of the goods are found by the Contractor, the State, any governmental agency, or court having jurisdiction to contain a defect, serious quality or performance deficiency, or not to be in compliance with any standard or requirement so as to require or make advisable that such goods be reworked or recalled, the Contractor will promptly communicate all relevant facts to the State Entity and undertake all corrective actions, including those required to meet all obligations imposed by laws, regulations, or orders, and shall file all necessary papers, corrective action programs, and other related documents, provided that nothing contained in this section shall preclude the State Entity from taking such action as may be required of it under any such law or regulation. The Contractor shall perform all necessary repairs or modifications at its sole expense except to any extent that the Contractor and the State Entity shall agree to the performance of such repairs by the State Entity upon mutually acceptable terms.

L. CONTRACT ADMINISTRATION

- 1. Order of Preference. In the case of any inconsistency or conflict among the specific provisions of the State Entity Standard Contract Terms and Conditions (including any amendments accepted by both the State Entity and the Contractor attached hereto), the RFP (including any subsequent addenda and written responses to bidders' questions), and the Contractor's Response, any inconsistency or conflict shall be resolved as follows:
 - (i) First, by giving preference to the specific provisions of the State Entity Standard Contract Terms and Conditions.
 - (ii) Second, by giving preference to the specific provisions of the RFP.
 - (iii) Third, by giving preference to the specific provisions of the Contractor's Response, except that objections or amendments by a Contractor that have not been explicitly accepted by the State Entity in writing shall not be included in this Contract and shall be given no weight or consideration.
- 2. Intent of References to Bid Documents. The references to the parties' obligations, which are contained in this document, are intended to supplement or clarify the obligations as stated in the RFP and the Contractor's Response. The failure of the parties to make reference to the terms of the RFP or the Contractor's Response in this document shall not be construed as creating a conflict and will not relieve the Contractor of the contractual obligations imposed by the terms of the RFP and the Contractor's Response. The contractual obligations of the State Entity cannot be implied from the Contractor's Response.
- 3. Compliance with the Law. The Contractor, its employees, agents, and subcontractors shall comply with all applicable federal, state, and local laws, rules, ordinances, regulations and orders now or hereafter in effect when performing under the Contract, including without limitation, all laws applicable to the prevention of discrimination in employment and the use of targeted small businesses as subcontractors or contractors. The Contractor, its employees,

agents and subcontractors shall also comply with all federal, state and local laws regarding business permits and licenses that may be required to carry out the work performed under the Contract. Contractor and Contractor's personnel shall also comply with all State and State Entity policies and standards in effect during the performance of the Contract, including but not limited to the State Entity's policies and standards relating to personnel conduct, security, safety, confidentiality, and ethics. Further, the provisions of O.C.G.A. Section 45-10-20 et seq. have not and must not be violated under the terms of this Contract.

- 4. **Drug-free Workplace**. The Contractor hereby certifies as follows:
 - (i) Contractor will not engage in the unlawful manufacture, sale, distribution, dispensation, possession, or use of a controlled substance or marijuana during the performance of this Contract; and
 - (ii) If Contractor has more than one employee, including Contractor, Contractor shall provide for such employee(s) a drug-free workplace, in accordance with the Georgia Drug-free Workplace Act as provided in O.C.G.A. Section 50-24-1 et seq., throughout the duration of this Contract; and
 - (iii) Contractor will secure from any subcontractor hired to work on any job assigned under this Contract the following written certification: "As part of the subcontracting agreement with (Contractor's Name), (Subcontractor's Name) certifies to the contractor that a drug-free workplace will be provided for the subcontractor's employees during the performance of this Contract pursuant to paragraph 7 of subsection (b) of Code Section 50-24-3."

Contractor may be suspended, terminated, or debarred if it is determined that:

- (i) Contractor has made false certification here in above; or
- (ii) Contractor has violated such certification by failure to carry out the requirements of O.C.G.A. Section 50-24-3(b).
- 5. Amendments. The Contract may be amended in writing from time to time by mutual consent of the parties. If the contract award exceeds the delegated purchasing authority of the State Entity, then the State Entity must obtain approval of the amendment from the Department of Administrative Services (DOAS). All amendments to the Contract must be in writing and fully executed by duly authorized representatives of the State Entity and the Contractor.
- **6. Third Party Beneficiaries.** There are no third-party beneficiaries to the Contract. The Contract is intended only to benefit the State Entity, the State, and the Contractor.
- 7. Choice of Law and Forum. The laws of the State of Georgia shall govern and determine all matters arising out of or in connection with this Contract without regard to the choice of law provisions of State law. In the event any proceeding of a quasi-judicial or judicial nature is commenced in connection with this Contract, such proceeding shall solely be brought in a court or other forum of competent jurisdiction within Fulton County, Georgia. This provision shall not be construed as waiving any immunity to suit or liability, including without limitation sovereign immunity, which may be available to the State.
- **8. Assignment and Delegation.** The Contract may not be assigned, transferred or conveyed in whole or in part without the prior written consent of the State Entity. For the purpose of construing this clause, a transfer of a controlling interest in the Contractor shall be considered an assignment.

- 9. Use of Third Parties. Except as may be expressly agreed to in writing by the State Entity, Contractor shall not subcontract, assign, delegate or otherwise permit anyone other than Contractor or Contractor's personnel to perform any of Contractor's obligations under this Contract or any of the work subsequently assigned under this Contract. No subcontract which Contractor enters into with respect to performance of obligations or work assigned under the Contract shall in any way relieve Contractor of any responsibility, obligation or liability under this Contract and for the acts and omissions of all subcontractors, agents, and employees. All restrictions, obligations and responsibilities of the Contractor under the Contract shall also apply to the subcontractors. Any contract with a subcontractor must also preserve the rights of the State Entity. The State Entity shall have the right to request the removal of a subcontractor from the Contract for good cause.
- **10. Integration.** The Contract represents the entire Contract between the parties. The parties shall not rely on any representation that may have been made which is not included in the Contract.
- **11. Headings or Captions.** The paragraph headings or captions used in the Contract are for identification purposes only and do not limit or construe the contents of the paragraphs.
- 12. Not a Joint Venture. Nothing in the Contract shall be construed as creating or constituting the relationship of a partnership, joint venture, (or other association of any kind or agent and principal relationship) between the parties thereto. Each party shall be deemed to be an independent contractor contracting for goods and services and acting toward the mutual benefits expected to be derived herefrom. Neither Contractor nor any of Contractor's agents, servants, employees, subcontractors or contractors shall become or be deemed to become agents, servants, or employees of the State. Contractor shall therefore be responsible for compliance with all laws, rules and regulations involving its employees and any subcontractors, including but not limited to employment of labor, hours of labor, health and safety, working conditions, workers' compensation insurance, and payment of wages. No party has the authority to enter into any contract or create an obligation or liability on behalf of, in the name of, or binding upon another party to the Contract.
- **13. Joint and Several Liability.** If the Contractor is a joint entity, consisting of more than one individual, partnership, corporation or other business organization, all such entities shall be jointly and severally liable for carrying out the activities and obligations of the Contract, and for any default of activities and obligations.
- **14.** Supersedes Former Contracts or Agreements. Unless otherwise specified in the Contract, this Contract supersedes all prior Contracts or Agreements between the State Entity and the Contractor for the goods and services provided in connection with the Contract.
- **15. Waiver.** Except as specifically provided for in a waiver signed by duly authorized representatives of the State Entity and the Contractor, failure by either party at any time to require performance by the other party or to claim a breach of any provision of the Contract shall not be construed as affecting any subsequent right to require performance or to claim a breach.

- **16. Notice.** Any and all notices, designations, consents, offers, acceptances or any other communication provided for herein shall be given in writing by registered or certified mail, return receipt requested, by receipted hand delivery, by Federal Express, courier or other similar and reliable carrier which shall be addressed to the person who signed the Contract on behalf of the party at the address identified in the State Entity Standard Contract Form. Each such notice shall be deemed to have been provided:
 - (i) At the time it is actually received; or,
 - (ii) Within one (1) day in the case of overnight hand delivery, courier or services such as Federal Express with guaranteed next day delivery; or,
 - (iii) Within five (5) days after it is deposited in the U.S. Mail in the case of registered U.S. Mail.

From time to time, the parties may change the name and address of the person designated to receive notice. Such change of the designated person shall be in writing to the other party and as provided herein.

- 17. Cumulative Rights. The various rights, powers, options, elections and remedies of any party provided in the Contract shall be construed as cumulative and not one of them is exclusive of the others or exclusive of any rights, remedies or priorities allowed either party by law, and shall in no way affect or impair the right of any party to pursue any other equitable or legal remedy to which any party may be entitled as long as any default remains in any way unremedied, unsatisfied or undischarged.
- 18. Severability. If any provision of the Contract is determined by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or unenforceable, such determination shall not affect the validity or enforceability of any other part or provision of the Contract. Further, if any provision of the Contract is determined to be unenforceable by virtue of its scope, but may be made enforceable by a limitation of the provision, the provision shall be deemed to be amended to the minimum extent necessary to render it enforceable under the applicable law. Any agreement of the parties to amend, modify, eliminate, or otherwise change any part of this Contract shall not affect any other part of this Contract, and the remainder of this Contract shall continue to be of full force and effect.
- **19. Time is of the Essence.** Time is of the essence with respect to the performance of the terms of the Contract. Contractor shall ensure that all personnel providing goods and services to the State are responsive to the State's requirements and requests in all respects.
- **20. Authorization.** The persons signing this Contract represent and warrant to the other parties that:
 - (i) It has the right, power and authority to enter into and perform its obligations under the Contract; and
 - (ii) It has taken all requisite action (corporate, statutory or otherwise) to approve execution, delivery and performance of the Contract and the Contract constitutes a legal, valid and binding obligation upon itself in accordance with its terms.
- **21.** Successors in Interest. All the terms, provisions, and conditions of the Contract shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the parties hereto and their respective successors, assigns and legal representatives.

- Record Retention and Access. The Contractor shall maintain books, records and documents in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles and procedures and which sufficiently and properly document and calculate all charges billed to the State throughout the term of the Contract for a period of at least five (5) years following the date of final payment or completion of any required audit, whichever is later. Records to be maintained include both financial records and service records. The Contractor shall permit the Auditor of the State of Georgia or any authorized representative of the State Entity, and where federal funds are involved, the Comptroller General of the United States, or any other authorized representative of the United States government, to access and examine, audit, excerpt and transcribe any directly pertinent books, documents, papers, electronic or optically stored and created records or other records of the Contractor relating to orders, invoices or payments or any other documentation or materials pertaining to the Contract, wherever such records may be located during normal business hours. The Contractor shall not impose a charge for audit or examination of the Contractor's books and records. If an audit discloses incorrect billings or improprieties, the State reserves the right to charge the Contractor for the cost of the audit and appropriate reimbursement. Evidence of criminal conduct will be turned over to the proper authorities.
- **23. Solicitation.** The Contractor warrants that no person or selling agency (except bona fide employees or selling agents maintained for the purpose of securing business) has been employed or retained to solicit and secure the Contract upon an agreement or understanding for commission, percentage, brokerage or contingency.
- **24. Public Records.** The laws of the State of Georgia, including the Georgia Open Records Act, as provided in O.C.G.A. Section 50-18-70 et seq., require procurement records and other records to be made public unless otherwise provided by law.
- 25. Clean Air and Water Certification. Contractor certifies that none of the facilities it uses to produce goods provided under the Contract are on the Environmental Protection State Entity (EPA) List of Violating Facilities. Contractor will immediately notify the State Entity of the receipt of any communication indicating that any of Contractor's facilities are under consideration to be listed on the EPA List of Violating Facilities.
- 26. Debarred, Suspended, and Ineligible Status. Contractor certifies that the Contractor and/or any of its subcontractors have not been debarred, suspended, or declared ineligible by any agency of the State of Georgia or as defined in the Federal Acquisition Regulation (FAR) 48 C.F.R. Ch.1 Subpart 9.4. Contractor will immediately notify the State Entity if Contractor is debarred by the State or placed on the Consolidated List of Debarred, Suspended, and Ineligible Contractors by a federal entity.
- 27. Use of Name or Intellectual Property. Contractor agrees it will not use the name or any intellectual property, including but not limited to, State trademarks or logos in any manner, including commercial advertising or as a business reference, without the expressed prior written consent of the State.
- 28. Taxes. The State Entity is exempt from Federal Excise Taxes, and no payment will be made for any taxes levied on Contractor's employee's wages. The State Entity is exempt from State and Local Sales and Use Taxes on the services. Tax Exemption Certificates will be furnished upon request. Contractor or an authorized subcontractor has provided the State Entity with a sworn verification regarding the filing of unemployment taxes or persons assigned by Contractor to perform services required in this Contract, which verification is incorporated herein by reference.

- 29. Certification Regarding Sales and Use Tax. By executing the Contract the Contractor certifies it is either (a) registered with the State Department of Revenue, collects, and remits State sales and use taxes as required by Georgia law, including Chapter 8 of Title 48 of the O.C.G.A.; or (b) not a "retailer" as defined in O.C.G.A. Section 48-8-2. The Contractor also acknowledges that the State may declare the Contract void if the above certification is false. The Contractor also understands that fraudulent certification may result in the State Entity or its representative filing for damages for breach of contract.
- 30. Delay or Impossibility of Performance. Neither party shall be in default under the Contract if performance is delayed or made impossible by an act of God. In each such case, the delay or impossibility must be beyond the control and without the fault or negligence of the Contractor. If delay results from a subcontractor's conduct, negligence or failure to perform, the Contractor shall not be excused from compliance with the terms and obligations of the Contract.
- **31.** Limitation of Contractor's Liability to the State. Except as otherwise provided in this Contract, Contractor's liability to the State for any claim of damages arising out of this Contract shall be limited to direct damages and shall not exceed the total amount paid to Contractor for the performance under this Contract.

No limitation of Contractor's liability shall apply to Contractor's liability for loss or damage to State equipment or other property while such equipment or other property is in the sole care, custody, and control of Contractor's personnel. Contractor hereby expressly agrees to assume all risk of loss or damage to any such State equipment or other property in the care, custody, and control of Contractor's personnel. Contractor further agrees that equipment transported by Contractor personnel in a vehicle belonging to Contractor (including any vehicle rented or leased by Contractor or Contractor's personnel) shall be deemed to be in the sole care, custody, and control of Contractor's personnel while being transported. Nothing in this section shall limit or affect Contractor's liability arising from claims brought by any third party.

- **32. Obligations Beyond Contract Term.** The Contract shall remain in full force and effect to the end of the specified term or until terminated or canceled pursuant to the Contract. All obligations of the Contractor incurred or existing under the Contract as of the date of expiration, termination or cancellation will survive the termination, expiration or conclusion of the Contract.
- **33.** Counterparts. The parties agree that the Contract has been or may be executed in several counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original and all such counterparts shall together constitute one and the same instrument.
- **34.** Further Assurances and Corrective Instruments. The parties agree that they will, from time to time, execute, acknowledge and deliver, or cause to be executed, acknowledged and delivered, such supplements hereto and such further instruments as may reasonably be required for carrying out the expressed intention of the Contract.
- 35. Transition Cooperation and Cooperation with other Contractors. Contractor agrees that upon termination of this Contract for any reason, it shall provide sufficient efforts and cooperation to ensure an orderly and efficient transition of services to the State or another contractor. The Contractor shall provide full disclosure to the State and the third-party contractor about the equipment, software, or services required to perform services for the State. The Contractor shall transfer licenses or assign agreements for any software or third-party services used to provide the services to the State or to another contractor.

Further, in the event that the State has entered into or enters into agreements with other contractors for additional work related to services rendered under the Contract, Contractor agrees to cooperate fully with such other contractors. Contractor shall not commit any act, which will interfere with the performance of work by any other contractor.

GCS has 6 years experience with the weekly compliance report. The report helps identify any issues, and most beneficially any recurring ones. GCS supervisors review the compliance report and develop action plans based on the issue. An example would be a facility reporting that their order was not stacked properly. We first try to determine if the issue occurred in picking, loading, or delivery. Once we have determined the process where the issue occurred we try to determine if the issue was due to lack or training/knowledge. If the employee needs counseling or training it is given. If improvement doesn't occur then disciplinary action follows.

Georgia Commissary Suppliers (GCS) operates out of two warehouses in the state of Georgia. We employee a fleet of GCS operated trucks and drivers that will be dispatched in accordance to the approved delivery schedule. Any deviation from that schedule will be reported to the facility prior to the delivery time.

If the mission of a facility changes that requires a new delivery day or time we will work with them to accommodate that request. We will also coordinate any necessary changes to the ice cream delivery.

GCS has proven over the last 6 years of the current contract that they can meet the delivery requirements of the GDC facilities.

CACTAS System Overview

Introduction

The Cashless Commissary and Trust Fund Accounting System (CACTAS), which was initially developed in 1992 specifically to provide a state-of-the-art cashless commissary and trust fund accounting system for prison units, has evolved over the past 21 years into a standard-setting solution for the corrections industry.

CACTAS was first developed by CSi in response to a requirement generated by the North Carolina Department of Correction. Working closely with the NC-DOC team, CSi developed a system that utilized magnetic stripe ID card and UPC bar code scanning technology in the commissaries, the latest personal computer and local area network technology throughout their institutions, and powerful but easy to use back office accounting capability.

CACTAS has evolved through 7 major product releases, starting with a DOS product in 1992 and evolving to a client server version incorporating powerful micro computer RDBMS technology released in 2002. This version of CACTAS successfully consolidated all trust accounting and commissary operations onto a single database in the Arkansas Department of Corrections. The SQL version of CACTAS served as the foundation from which our CACTAS Enterprise Web Edition was developed and released in April of 2006 under contract with the Ohio Department of Rehabilitation and Correction (ODRC).

This version of CACTAS has successfully consolidated all trust accounting and commissary operations in the ODRC. Over 50,000 active inmates housed in 33 Ohio prisons are successfully managed using this outstanding product. Its 3 tier architecture utilizes the Microsoft SQL Server RDBMS (versions 2005, or 2008), a middle tier application based on Microsoft's Windows Server 2003 or 2008, Internet Information Services 6 (IIS), and the .Net framework runtime. Finally the client application utilizes Microsoft's Internet Explorer and .Net runtime to produce an easy to use browser and smart client application. These components plus the advanced CACTAS database design offer a robust and secure environment that is capable of handling the intense load of an enterprise wide application.

The most recent enhancements to our CACTAS offering are in the area of services that support the solution. The following list of related services is available to any CSi client that is running the Enterprise Web Edition of CACTAS.

• Hosting Services – CSi offers the CACTAS software solution as a service. We can host the system website and required databases on CSi provided capacity from Amazon Web Services "Amazon Elastic Compute Cloud (Amazon EC2)". This is the most advanced cloud computing environment in existence. Amazon EC2's web service interface allows us to provide resizable compute capacity in the cloud. Rather than deploy fixed hardware components that would tend to be either over or under utilized depending on the pace of growth of the CSi Hosted Solutions environment, this cloud computing environment provides assurance that the correct computing capacity is available at all times by eliminating the need to obtain fixed hardware components as CSi grows its network of hosted CACTAS solutions.

This is especially attractive for those agencies who do not have sophisticated IT capabilities and find it difficult to manage web sites and servers. Through our hosting services offering we can reduce the entire CACTAS solution to a simple fee for service agreement where CSi provides everything needed with the exception of computer workstation hardware and a broad band connection to the internet.

- Fast and secure on line deposit services CSi provides a deposit service for CACTAS users that
 allows the public at large to make trust fund deposits to CACTAS inmates. The deposit
 transactions are executed by navigating to http://www.CommissaryDeposit.com and using a
 valid credit/debit card to transfer funds from the cardholder account to the selected CACTAS
 resident account. Secure socket layer (SSL) encryption protocol is forced once the user
 advances to the page when his/her card account information is entered. Inmate searches and
 deposit postings are performed in real time insuring that deposits are never posted to inactive
 inmates.
- On line commissary ordering is also available from http://www.CommissaryDeposit.com. This service provides the capability to offer special commissary packages and/or special items that are not available through normal commissary orders such as holiday packages, etc. to be purchased by friends or family and delivered to your inmates. Our site would accept the orders from the public, collect payment via credit/debit card, and provide order processing services to the appropriate distribution facility for pick, pack, and shipment to your facility.
- The most recent addition to the electronic funds processing features of CACTAS is Electronic Cash Deposits. CSi has teamed with ACH Payment Solutions, Inc. to offer this exciting addition to our electronic funds processing program. ACH Payment Solutions has teamed with literally thousands of convenience store and other small retail businesses located across the U.S. From any of these locations members of the public can send electronic cash deposits directly to an inmate's trust account regardless of where the corrections facility is located when the facility is installed with CACTAS. The funds are posted to the inmate trust account in real time making the funds available for the inmate's use immediately. The funds are deposited to the facility's trust fund bank account twice per week via ACH transmission, same as www.commissaryDeposit.com deposits. - CACTAS offers self operated lobby kiosk support to process inmate deposits from jail visitors utilizing cash/debit cards or cash tender.
- CACTAS also offers a release kiosk application that provides an automated cash disbursement capability to inmates at the time of release. This device eliminates the need to issue release checks and/or release debit cards in small amounts. The kiosk has a coin and bill dispenser allowing exact amounts to be released to the inmate. Through configuration the jail facility determines the portion of an inmate's personal balance to issue in cash from the kiosk vs. check or PIN based debit card.

- When the release kiosk is not deployed, the CACTAS release disbursement task offers the use of prepaid debit card payments in combination with traditional check and cash tender.
- An intake kiosk application is also available. This configuration is similar to the lobby kiosk but includes the ability to accept coins in addition to the bill acceptor offered on both the lobby and intake configurations. Therefore this device can accept any exact amount of cash that a new intake may have at the time of intake. We also include a card swipe device so that bail deposits may be accepted if the inmate has a valid debit or credit card. Finally the kiosk is equipped with a thermal receipt printer to document the transactions done on behalf of a new intake.
- CACTAS offers inmate kiosk support for inmates to check account balances, view account
 activity, enter commissary orders, inmate to staff messaging, read inmate handbook and other
 documents, and more depending on jail administration requirements.

Though CACTAS has changed dramatically over time, the CSi corporate mission has remained constant: To serve the Corrections Industry with quality software and services products. Our pledge is to lead corrections in the application of new technology as it applies to inmate banking and commissary automation systems.

Once commissary orders are entered the picking slips are immediately available for printing either on site or off site by your in house commissary staff or private commissary services vendor. Upon delivery of bagged commissary orders CACTAS offers positive identification of inmates by electronic signature capture or through the use of hand held PDA scanning devices.

Overview of System Operations

All areas of the CACTAS system are fully integrated and use a common Microsoft SQL Server RDBMS. The CACTAS database is designed to support large multi-prison corrections organizations from a central database repository. The CACTAS database utilizes over 350 tables, 1040 stored procedures, and 240 SQL functions to form the core component of the CACTAS three tier design. The middle application (web services) layer consists of over 100 web pages and multiple .NET click once deployed smart clients based on Microsoft's Windows Server 2008, Internet Information Services 6 (IIS), and the .NET framework runtime 3.5. All CACTAS function is executed from normal web pages with the exception of the point-of-sale application, receipt printing, check printing, kiosk applications, and CACTAS reporting. These features utilize .NET smart client applications that are launched from web pages. These components offer a robust and secure environment that is capable of handling the intense load of an enterprise wide application. Finally the client application utilizes Microsoft's Internet Explorer and .NET runtime to produce an easy to use browser and smart client application that does not require proprietary CSi software to be present on the client workstation.

The system offers full function trust account management, commissary automation, self-service kiosk capability, and back office double entry accounting that features accounts receivable, accounts payable, general ledger, inventory management, and financial reporting for your inmate welfare fund, inmate club, and other organization activity. CACTAS sales are conducted from a highly automated point-of-sale (POS) application offering advanced features such as support for thermal receipt printers, electronic signature capture, line item voids, pricing overrides, use of shopping cycles, bar code scanning, item restrictions, spending limit management, sale of spending limit exempt items and non-exempt items within the same sale, and indigent inmate sales. CACTAS offers an Inmate operated self-service kiosk, IVR (interactive voice response) telephone interface, and OMR (optical mark reader) scanner interface to support commissary order entry in addition to POS. CACTAS offers the ultimate in positive


identification of inmates and automation of error corrections upon delivery of bagged orders. If the jail is suited for commissary delivery from a central point, CACTAS supports electronic signature capture, real time credit for missing items and other corrections, plus receipt printing at the point of delivery. If the jail is not suited for commissary delivery from a central point, CACTAS supports the use of a hand held remote device (PDA) for delivery of commissary. This device can assure positive identification by scanning unique transaction number bar codes from commissary receipts or picking lists and matching them with their intended inmate by scanning inmate bar coded wrist bands or identification cards. CACTAS also supports the use of PDA devices for receiving purchased merchandise, stock transfers, and physical inventory counting procedures.

The CACTAS database tables are designed to track inmate activity via an unlimited number of user-defined inmate classifications. Other system function can be easily associated with inmate classification categories at the user's discretion. At intake, this allows the inmate classification to serve as a template for easy assignment of other system parameters such as account types, commissary restrictions, shopping frequency controls, spending limits, withdrawal limits, and deposit limits by quantity and accumulative value. If any of the detail of a given inmate classification needs to be modified for individual inmates this is easily accomplished. For example, if an inmate is assigned to the work release classification and the user has defined work release to include a savings account type that collects 25% of inmate wages, CACTAS allows specific collection limits and collection amounts to be set for individual inmates that are different from the generic definition set for the work release class. All other parameters of work release would continue to apply to the inmate except the specific modifications made at the individual inmate record level.

CACTAS inmate banking controls on deposits and debt/restitution collections are set through the use of enterprise level business process tables. However, individual institutions are always able to override enterprise rules and set facility/institution level rules if required. Therefore, CACTAS allows the enterprise organization the best of both worlds. The enterprise may centrally control those things that management does not want individual institutions to alter and conversely implement distribution of controls to the facility/institution levels when central control is not warranted.

The following illustration graphically displays the CACTAS 3-tier architecture as implemented in the Ohio Department of Rehabilitation and Corrections (ODRC).





Trust Fund Functions

Within the scope of jail and prison management, there is nothing more important than inmate trust fund accounting. It is absolutely critical that trust fund administrators be able to perform an everincreasing variety of transactions to inmate trust fund accounts. These transactions must be performed efficiently and accurately, but most importantly an audit trail must be maintained. Human errors must be easily corrected that include reversing transactions where audit trails of the original (erroneous) task, the reversing task, and the corrected task are all maintained and which can be recalled and verified on a moments notice. CACTAS meets this challenge by offering an extremely rich set of trust fund functions. CACTAS maintains an unlimited number of subsidiary accounts by inmate ID number. In addition to a user defined inmate ID number, the CACTAS database allows the user to maintain personal ID numbers and social security numbers for each inmate. The personal ID is intended to be a permanent identification that does not change from one booking to the next. Additionally, the CACTAS inmate record contains the following data elements: Last Name, First Name, Middle Name, Address, Dob, Gender, Race, Account Index/Pin, six levels of housing hierarchy (Facility, Building, Pod, Section, Bay, Bed), Classification, Class Override flag, Account Override flag, Created on date, Booked on date, Projected Release date, Released on date, Transferred on date, Prior Facility, Balance checked on date, and Notes.

CACTAS allows the user to define an unlimited number of received on account (ROA) transaction types. At the discretion of the user ROA funds may be applied to the inmate account immediately, or they may be placed in a pending state to be applied later by batch processing after allowing time for checks and money orders to clear. Each ROA type may be defined to automate specific requirements for that type of deposit. For example, inmate wages may require that distributions be made to specific recipients such as dependents, crime victim funds, court filing fees, or savings. Upon execution of a ROA transaction certain standard data elements are always captured by the user. Examples would be ROA type, amount, serial number, check #, etc. Other ROA types may require capture and reporting of certain additional data elements that are not usually captured. An example may be withholding information contained on the stub of a work release paycheck. In order to meet these special requirements CACTAS utilizes the ability to define custom forms. Once the custom form is defined it may be used to execute the task and allow the user to capture the information required. CSi utilizes this capability to meet the reporting requirements of certain PIE, joint venture, and work release programs as it relates to inmate paycheck withholding data.

Accounts, Account Types, and Case Management

CACTAS allows the user to define an unlimited number of account types. Each account type is flagged as either a personal (example would be POS account) or a non-personal account (example would be medical co-pay). Only account balances for personal accounts are returned to the inmate upon release. Any subset of account types may be associated with each inmate trust account; the subset of account types assigned is usually determined by inmate classification. However, the set of account types associated with any given inmate may be modified at the inmate level. Inmate collection and disbursement of funds are processed through these vehicles.

Each inmate will be assigned a default account and any number of point-of-sale accounts (POS discretionary spending accounts). The default account accumulates any inmate funds that are not reserved for some specific purpose. The total fund balance of all POS accounts may be used at the discretion of the inmate for such things as commissary purchases. The default account may also be a POS account but it does not have to be.

Often times there are requirements to track the disbursement of inmate funds at a more detailed level than the account type that collected the funds. CACTAS has employed a detailed case tracking functionality to accommodate this need. An unlimited number of unique court ordered case numbers may be defined and tracked for each inmate account type. The cases may be created from the same page and at the same time that the original court ordered debt is created (resident charge task page).

Cases are often created for child/spousal support, court ordered victim restitution, or any form of inmate debt that requires detailed payment records and debt balance tracking. Disbursements may be calculated as fixed amounts or percentage amounts that prorate payments across all cases for the collection account type or paid sequentially via priority of the cases. Case payments (disbursement of funds) are made to predetermined recipients. These recipients may be individual recipients or they may be payees that receive similar funds from multiple inmates and cases. When the payee is an individual the pay to and address of the recipient is entered on the case record itself and established at the time the charge task is executed. Enterprise payees are maintained from a separate maintenance page and they may also have sub-payee levels. An example may be a payee that represents a state wide social service agency that receives all court ordered child support payments and a sub-payee level may be the county within the state where the court order originated. CACTAS tracks collection and disbursement activity in detail and is able to generate detailed reports that accompany the disbursement checks to inform the receiving agency which individual cases and what portion of the group check to apply to each case.

CACTAS allows for inmate account types to collect incoming funds per 4 account type status selections. The status selection establishes stopping rules for collection of funds for the account type in question. The type of charge assessed for a give inmate and account type determines the status of the account. A given account will be in one of the following status settings: off, debt, date, or perpetual. The off status means that the account will not attempt to collect any incoming funds. Debt status means that the account will try to collect some specified amount per the collection rules that have been established for the account type and inmate. Once the debt amount is satisfied the account will discontinue collections until another charge is made. Date status means the account will collect funds per the established collection rules until the specified date has been reached. The perpetual status means that the account will continue collections per the collection rules indefinitely (examples would be child support orders that demand payment be made but do not specify a specific debt amount).

Generally there are two general ledger accounts associated with each resident account type. One to track the collected balance of the account and one to track the account debt balance. CACTAS design will allow multiple inmate accounts to be tracked by common general ledger debt accounts and/or balance accounts if appropriate however. Debt balances of a given account type are carried as negative balances and reflected in the debt general ledger account balance as a debit balance. Collected funds are reflected as positive balances and carried in the collected account balance general ledger account as a credit balance.

The debt balance for a given account type always represents uncollected funds. Collection of funds will of course reduce the debt balance and be reflected as a positive collected account balance. Positive account balances are easily disbursed to approved payees in the form of checks or cash. Collected account balances may be negative (representing an overdraft) but debt balances will never have a positive balance. For example the units that accumulate indigent inmate charges for personal hygiene items distributed through their indigent programs may choose how the indigent debt is carried on their trust fund books. One option is to accumulate negative POS balances for their indigent population. The other option is to create debt balances in an indigent charges account and therefore eliminate negative personal account balances. With either option the process is fully automated and accounted for. Collection/Debt accounts are used to collect and disburse funds to specific recipients, such as medical co-payments, victim restitution, property damage, per diem fees, and other user defined inmate charges. As charges are assessed, the funds may be taken from the inmates default account or the user may designate another account if desired. Available funds are deducted from the inmate's personal balance and placed into the charge account balance that is available for disbursement to the appropriate recipient in the form of check, cash or EFT. If funds are not available at the time of assessment, or if the user chooses not to collect funds at the time of charge, a negative balance or lien will remain in the charged account's debt balance to be collected as funds become available for this purpose.

CACTAS also has a powerful funds transfer capability that allows transfer of funds between accounts of an individual resident, or even between inmates within the same institution.

Other Fund Accounts

CACTAS allows using facilities to define an unlimited number of facility accounts (other fund accounts). These accounts represent money that is on deposit in the trust fund bank account but that does not belong to inmates. Funds may be transferred into these accounts from inmate accounts or funds may be transferred out of other funds accounts to inmate accounts. Funds may be deposited directly into these accounts and funds withdrawn for other funds accounts in the form of checks or cash. Journals may be done between other funds accounts and even between other funds accounts and selected system general ledger accounts such as checking, cash on hand, checkbook adjustments, un-disbursed commissions, etc. Other fund accounts may be configured to allow overdraft of the inmate account with other fund transfers or to deny overdrafts. Typically if inmate services that are collected through other funds transfer are denied when the inmate does not have sufficient funds the user would configure the other funds account to deny inmate overdraft. Typical uses of other funds accounts would be to collect inmate payment for certain services and/or items such as postage, copies, etc.

Release Disbursement Capability

CACTAS has a rich release disbursement functional capability. All inmate personal account balances are displayed on this screen giving the user a complete real time status of the inmate to be released. The user may issue gate funds at the time of release and may either cancel or deliver any undelivered commissary sales of the inmate. If undelivered sales are cancelled the related funds are included in the balance that is returned to the inmate. Personal funds due the inmate may be disbursed in the form of cash, debit card, check or any combination of the three, all possible from the same release disbursement page. At the time of release, CACTAS accounts are not purged from the database but they are made inactive. Upon booking of the same personal ID at some future date, the inactive account is then made active and all balances are reinstated as they were at the point of release. Therefore a subsequent booking will reinstate unpaid debt and unclaimed funds that are not settled at the time of release.

Reports

A suite of standard reports is available that will meet the needs of most users. All CACTAS standard reports allow for a high degree of user customization. CACTAS report screens support such capability as single and multiple column filters, single and multiple column sorting, drag and drop of columns, and a drive down feature to display another level of detail where appropriate. Selected sections of larger reports may be displayed and printed while omitting the unselected portions. Custom formatted versions of selected reports are available by default and others may be created from standard report lists. Any CACTAS report may be saved to a Microsoft Excel spreadsheet or in Adobe .PDF formats if desired.

CACTAS supports powerful ad hoc custom processing and reporting tools through the use of its custom forms feature. Any custom form reports that we develop for our user community but do not include as part of the standard suite of CACTAS reports are made available to all users through this user-friendly feature. The custom report is generated and is available for printing with the same customization tools (column add & delete plus saving in Excel and .PDF formats) as standard CACTAS reports. Users can develop custom reports of their own by using this same tool. When used in this way a minimum level of SQL programming skills are required.

CACTAS custom forms provide powerful capability other than reporting as well. Users may execute system and inmate custom processes, and data capture forms. A minimum level of Microsoft standard query language (SQL) skill is required by users to set up this powerful capability. If your organization does not have access to the level of SQL skills to independently create the desired process, the CSi Help Desk will gladly assist. Typically this functionality is utilized in one or some combination of the following ways:

- 1. Capture custom data that is not captured by standard CACTAS functionality. The custom data capture forms may be linked to some other CACTAS task or they may be standalone processes. The data fields to be captured may be totally user defined.
- Standalone processes may be created that call a standard CACTAS task as an integral part of the
 custom process or even multiple standard CACTAS tasks. In addition to calling existing CACTAS
 database functions and/or procedures, the user can actually write SQL logic to be executed by
 the standalone custom process.
- 3. Most commonly this capability is used to generate and format custom reporting from data that may already exist on the CACTAS database. There already exist a large number of database functions and procedures that may be utilized by the custom process or the user may want to write a totally new report query from scratch. The user may include filters on any report column, sorting is allowed by any column, and the capability to export custom reports to Excel, text, or .PDF formats is a standard feature.

Inventory Management

CACTAS provides a comprehensive set of inventory management functions. Management control of commissary inventory investment is optimized when the techniques supported by this system are implemented and practiced on a consistent basis. Item number level detail is tracked for an unlimited number of service centers and store locations within a prison enterprise. The data is summarized by user defined inventory categories to enhance analysis and reporting effectiveness. Category definitions also provide an automated retail pricing capability. CACTAS allows for identification of indigent inmate welfare items and their rates of distribution, plus item purchase restriction capability. Any subset of inmates may be restricted from purchasing any given items totally or the restriction may be to allow purchases but restrict the quantity purchased to some limit over a designated period of time.

Item File Maintenance

CACTAS commissary item tables are maintained at three levels (enterprise, customer, and service center). The master item record (enterprise level) is the base product that any service center may choose to include in their product menu or not. Any master product may be sold in an unlimited number of package sizes (single can, six pack, case, etc.) to customers by pointing multiple customer item records with different scan codes and multipliers to a common master record. Lastly the CACTAS service center item tables maintain all inventory asset value and quantity on hand (QOH) records. CACTAS utilizes weighted average cost accounting per generally accepted accounting principle (GAAP) standards.

All items are assigned a user defined sales type. Commissary sales may be categorized by sales type for reporting purposes, taxation, etc. CACTAS allows item records to be designated as stock or non-stock items. Non-stock items may be sold but only revenue is recorded, they are never purchased and do not have a cost of sales component. The combination of sales type tracking and non-stock item status allows CACTAS commissaries to sell specialty items on behalf of authorized inmate clubs and other organizations simultaneously while conducting normal commissary sales. Typically non-stock items may be pictures, car wash, hair cut, etc. Normal commissary items and non-stock items may be sold in the same sales transaction. Monthly due to the CACTAS sales type tracking capability these club or organization (non-commissary) revenues may be purged off the commissary accounting books and transferred to CACTAS organization books. See the description of CACTAS organization function below.

Retail Pricing Update

CACTAS provides automated retail pricing capability through this function. When executed the retail price of each item is calculated by uplifting its last cost by the uplift parameter for that item's inventory category. Retail prices are maintained in the customer item table therefore making it possible to establish selling price by customer with multiple customers being serviced from the same service center. CACTAS pricing function is sensitive to different pricing parameters that may exists across multiple

customers by maintaining a customer sensitive inventory category table that allows for uplift parameters to be maintained by customer. In order to make the new prices calculated by this function effective at the point-of-sale, the user must execute the Post Prices function following a retail pricing update run. This function allows users to provide advance notice to the inmate population after price changes have been calculated but prior to implementation.

Category Maintenance

Commissary inventory items are classified by category. Categories are utilized to define retail-pricing criteria, define commission rates, indigent item discount rates, to apply sales restrictions, and to provide a summary level of data for sales analysis and inventory analysis reporting. Fixed pricing levels may be established at the individual item level and will always override the items category pricing criteria. Fixed pricing is used for items such as postage stamps and stamped envelopes where the user does not want retail price to depend on wholesale costs.

Special Items

Some users exempt specific items from spending limit policies. Examples may be items such as clothing that may be purchased without deduction from the inmate weekly or monthly spending limits. These special sale items are easily controlled with CACTAS. Special items are flagged and may be sold in the same commissary sales transaction as ordinary sale items. The sales application will recognize the portion of a sale that is special and allow that portion and that portion only to exceed the inmate spending limit but does not allow the total value of the sale to exceed the inmate's total POS balance.

Physical Inventory

Inventory Worksheets: A physical inventory worksheet is provided for each service center/store location. Periodically, these worksheets should be used to take physical inventory counts. The worksheets display all items for the given location sorted by item slot location, the system maintained quantity on hand, and a space provided to pencil in the actual count of each item. CACTAS also supports the use of hand held devices (PDA's) for physical inventory counting.

Inventory Adjustments: Upon completion of the physical inventory counts, the user should use the pages provided by this function to enter the counts. As counts are entered the system displays a variance that is determined by taking the actual count entered less the system maintained quantity on hand. Upon saving the adjustment, all system maintained quantity on hand values would be adjusted to the physical count entered. If no count was entered, the quantity on hand will not be changed. Additionally, the accumulative total change in inventory asset value will be posted to the general ledger inventory assets account with the off setting entry made to one of an unlimited number of user defined inventory adjustment accounts. Typical inventory adjustment accounts would be damaged merchandise, lost/stolen property, or the inventory over/short adjustment account. This allows for a much better audit trail with regards to inventory write-off.

Replenishment Ordering of Commissary Items

CACTAS inventory function provides a replenishment order recommendation and order placement capability to assist the user in placing replenishment orders of commissary items. The recommended order is based on min/max inventory control principles. The service center item table contains the following user defined parameters: minimum quantity, maximum quantity, and vendor case quantity. The CACTAS replenishment order recommendations are calculated per the following:

- 1. If quantity on hand plus quantity on order is greater than the minimum quantity, no order recommendation is made.
- 2. If quantity on hand plus quantity on order is less than the minimum quantity, an order recommendation is made by determining the whole number multiple of vendor case quantities required to increase the quantity on hand plus quantity on order to at least one unit greater

- than the maximum quantity but less than or equal to the maximum plus one vendor case quantity.
- 3. The recommended order is displayed to the user in a matrix format, which can be edited if necessary. Once the order has been reviewed and meets user approval, the order recommendation can be saved as a purchase order to match the user approved recommended order.

Purchase/Receive Inventory

CACTAS provides an easy and efficient function for receiving commissary merchandise, supplies, or making miscellaneous payments from the Commissary Accounting System. Using this function the user may create a new purchase, receive merchandise for which he has previously created purchase orders using CACTAS replenishment ordering, or he may make miscellaneous payments to vendors that are unrelated to commissary merchandise. The function allows the user to search the database for existing purchase orders, edit these orders for actual merchandise received, and post the resulting items and payable records to the accounting system for later disbursement of funds. Additionally, he may create new purchases for commissary items, miscellaneous supplies/services or any combination of the two. Upon completion, the purchased item quantities are posted to inventory quantity on hand records by service center/store and accounts payable documentation is created as appropriate. Point of Sale/Order Processing

CACTAS point of sale function has taken full advantage of proven computer automation technology from the private sector. Such things as bar code scanning, magnetic stripe technology and electronic signature capture are important ingredients of private sector retail automation; and they are now fully utilized by CACTAS in corrections. Whether your unit uses an order bagging operation or sells through a store window, CACTAS offers a sales application that can optimize your employee and inmate resources. If selling through a store, the CACTAS front end offers a system that is so secure and so easy to use that inmates can be used as register operators. They are used successfully in several of our CACTAS installations and they can be utilized successfully in your operation. For units who choose to bag orders, our design guarantees the maximum in order processing efficiency and accuracy by supporting an OMR bubble sheet scanner interface, an inmate operated kiosk interface, and hand held PDA devices to process and deliver your bagged commissary orders.

CACTAS offers the ultimate in canteen sales support. Each step in the sales process is performed with optimum speed and accuracy. Account identification can be accomplished by swiping the encoded magnetic stripe from an ID card, reading the bar code from a wristband, entering account number with key strokes, or simply utilizing an alpha search on the inmate name. Once the account identification process is complete, individual items are sold by either reading their UPC bar code with a bar code reader, entering the item number from a keyboard numeric pad, or the user may use an item lookup capability with choice of either item number or description as the search string.

When inmate operators are utilized, the CACTAS register is crippled such that it is capable of running only the sales application. This is accomplished through function provided by utilizing the standard Windows Local Security Policy functionality (Windows Policy Editor in older versions of Windows). This makes it impossible to accomplish anything except a sales transaction from this machine, and thus the use of inmate operators is feasible and economically attractive.

The CACTAS sales application utilizes a full screen monitor that clearly displays the sales transaction as it is created. A service center/store level user option is provided that will allow or block item sales that potentially drive the store quantity on hand into a negative value. Units who enter commissary orders remotely prior to pick will probably choose to not allow inventory overdraw; while those units selling from a store front environment would want to allow overdraw to proceed. A line item void feature is available plus repeat of last item sale is accomplished by simply pressing the enter key. A quantity key feature allows sales of large quantities of the same item to be accomplished quickly and easily. A receipt of each sales transaction is always printed on a receipt printer plus an electronic image of the

sales receipt is written to the CACTAS SQL Server database. The SQL sales transaction tables become the source data for report queries and audits of sales data.

For operations that do not use inmate operators, CACTAS offers a return sale capability. A return is invoked by entering the sale quantity as negative followed by scanning the item to be returned or by invoking the credit sales mode of operation. While in credit mode a return sale can be accomplished by entering positive quantities with no need for the operator to consciously enter a negative quantity. The user may toggle between credit mode and normal mode within a given sale by use of a function key. The results of a return are that the item is added back to the quantity on hand and the purchaser's account is issued a credit. Following each transaction, the purchaser's account is updated in real time mode with the appropriate debit or credit. A credit would result only if the volume returned to stock outweighs the sales volume. A sales reverse transaction is also available that will credit an entire sales transaction back to stock and leave the inmate trust account and service center/store inventory values just as they were before the sale. This function is particularly useful for rejected or undeliverable commissary orders. Special sale items are automatically accounted for when flagged as special items on the CACTAS item table. Special items are products whose purchase may exceed inmate spending limits but not total POS fund balances.

Other functions that are available from the sales application include retail price override, spending limit management, restricted item sales, and indigent item distribution. The CACTAS sales module may reject an entire sale or some portion of a sale for any one of three reasons. These reasons are (1) the purchaser has insufficient funds in the POS trust fund account, (2) the purchaser has exceeded his/her spending limit, or (3) the purchaser's account is coded such that it is barred from purchasing some set of restricted items. When any of these conditions are present, CACTAS simply rejects the item or items in violation. An unlimited number of restrictions or group restrictions may be placed on item, categories of items, or sub-categories of items. The CACTAS indigent item distribution function is a special type of restriction. These items are distributed to indigent inmates periodically from the normal sales function. The set of items allowed, their frequency of distribution, and the financial conditions defining an indigent inmate are all user defined and tracked in real time by the system.

Organization Management

The Enterprise Web Edition of CACTAS contains a subsystem used to manage organizations other than restitution, trust accounting, and commissary operations. An organization may be an inmate club or any other authorized group that needs to manage a check book, general ledger chart of accounts, sales, purchases, etc. In the state of Ohio CACTAS system there are examples of as many as 10 organizations within large institutions that are managed using this function. Organizations may have totally separate and unique bank accounts or they may share a common bank account with other organizations. Database maintenance (add, delete, edit) of organization definitions, charts of account and bank accounts is performed in CACTAS as an enterprise level object. Once an enterprise organization is created, each institution that has a need to keep books locally for that organization can create an institution organization record that points to the appropriate enterprise database record. Tasks that are available to manage the financial activity of organizations include:

- 1. Bank Deposit
- 2. Bank Reconciliation
- 3. Journals
- 4. Record unusable check
- 5. Sale
- 6. Withdrawal




