NOTICE OF POST-CONVICTION REMEDIES

Should the defendant seek to challenge this legal proceeding, the defendant may directly appeal from this conviction and/or sentence by filing a Notice of Appeal within thirty (30) days from the date this sentence is filed with the Clerk of Court. Alternatively, the defendant may file a Petition for *Habeas Corpus* in the county where he/she is detained. Starting from the date this sentence becomes final, such a petition must be filed within four (4) years for a Felony conviction; one (1) year for a Misdemeanor conviction; or one hundred eighty (180) days for a Traffic conviction. The defendant has been so advised.

FIREARMS

If you are convicted of a crime punishable by imprisonment for a term exceeding one year, or of a misdemeanor crime of domestic violence where you are or were a spouse, intimate partner, parent, or guardian of the victim, or are or were involved in another similar relationship with the victim, it is unlawful for you to possess or purchase a firearm including a rifle, pistol, or revolver, or ammunition, pursuant to federal law under 18 U.S.C. 922(g)(9) and/or applicable state law.

THE GRAND JURORS AFORESAID, IN THE NAME AND BEHALF OF THE CITIZENS OF GEORGIA, charge and accuse **EDWARD LOMINAC** with the offense of **AGGRAVATED ASSAULT (O.C.G.A. 16-5-21)**, for that the said accused, in the County and State aforesaid, on the 2nd day of April, 2023, did make an assault upon the person of Arthur Wimbush with his foot, an instrument which used offensively against a person is likely to result in serious bodily injury, by repeatedly kicking and stomping said person, contrary to the laws of said State, the good order, peace and dignity thereof.

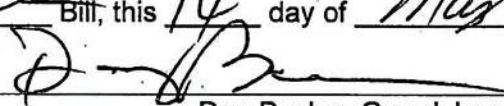

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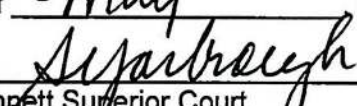
